Construction Update...

...and Your Part in the Process

Nabholz Construction has been hired to complete the renovations on our buildings. Scott Smith (member of sister parish St. Margaret's), the architect on this project, will see us through the entire process. Nabholz Construction will have all of the construction finished by August. This is ideal as it leaves a month to prepare our buildings for the new Day School and Sunday School year. In order for this schedule to succeed, we need to clean out our buildings!

An industrial trash can and two storage units are now on the south end of our parking lot by the Scout Hut. These units will stay for the duration on the construction. The EYC Center has been cleaned out so the Day School can begin moving their classrooms into the Youth Hall in March. Partitions will be used on half of the gym court to construct four classrooms. The other half of the court will be used for lunches, a play area, and extra class space. This is also the area which will be used on Sundays as the gathering space for the Road Trip Kids Sunday School (K-5), Children's Chapel and the Nursery. The Day School will also partition off five classrooms downstairs in the Undercroft. The Back Yard Kids (ages 3 and 4) Sunday School program will use one of these classrooms on Sunday mornings.

Once emptied, the EYC Center area will be thoroughly cleaned, downstairs and upstairs, to prepare for the classroom set-up. The week before spring break, Day School students will bring things over to their temporary

Rector's Reflections

God—the Ultimate Energy Source

Sometimes we think of God as a “mighty fortress” or a “rock” or “Father” or “Mother,” but God as “energy” can also be a helpful metaphor for understanding God. St. Paul, for example, in his Letter to the Romans referred to the gospel as the “power for salvation,” a power Paul had personally experienced in the risen Christ. “Dynamis,” the Greek word used by Paul as “power” comes from the same root as the word for “dynamite” or “dynamic.”

At one of my first meetings with parishioners of St. Mark's, we talked about our future, and about midway in our discussion, one parishioner spoke up and said that we needed a leader with energy. I replied that “I couldn't agree more, we do need leaders with energy, but added that likewise “we also need parishioners with energy. And furthermore, the kind of energy that we need comes from God, and can be experienced by each of us as we draw near to Christ.”

Lent is traditionally a time for repentance, prayer, fasting and giving alms to the poor, and each of these is very important. But Lent can also be a time to “recharge” our lives with the energy that only God can give. Jesus himself, several times in his ministry, was low on energy and would often withdraw for times of quiet, especially for times of quiet with his Father. And typically he emerged from such times renewed and ready to do the work he had been given to do—healing, caring, feeding, preaching and so much more. This Lent, may we follow the LORD's example and also withdraw for times of quiet with God, knowing that God is, indeed, the ultimate energy source.

Carey's Corner

*The following is an excerpt from
A Season for the Spirit
by Martin Smith*

Lent is the season for the Spirit of truth, who drove Jesus into the wilderness to initiate him into the truth which sets free. Mark's harsh word 'drove' was softened by Matthew and Luke to the milder expression 'led'. But this word 'drove' is very precious. I know that inertia, illusion and fear hold me back from answering God's invitation to enter into the truth and gain freedom. Yet even Jesus, free as he was from inertia like mine, needed the full force of the Wind of God (Spirit, Breath, Wind are all equally valid translations of the Greek word *pneuma*) to make him enter the testing-ground of the wilderness. If I am going forward into that truth for which God knows I am ready at this point in my life, I am going to need the Spirit to drive me. Perhaps then the word 'surrender' should be enough for our prayer on this Ash Wednesday. Not the surrender of submission to an enemy, but the opposite, the laying down of resistance to the One who loves me infinitely more than I can guess, the One who is more on my side than I am myself. Dwelling on this thought of letting go, and handing myself over to the Spirit will bring me much closer to the experience of Jesus than the word 'discipline' which so

many of us have been trained to invoke at the beginning of Lent. It should help us smile at our anxious attempts to bring our life under control, the belt-tightening resolutions about giving up this or taking on that. What we are called to give up in Lent is control itself! Deliberate efforts to impose discipline on our lives often serve only to lead us further away from the freedom which Jesus attained through surrender to the Spirit, and promised to give. 'Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.'

Lent is about freedom which is gained only through exposure to the truth. And 'What is truth?' Pilate's question is partially answered by unpacking the Greek word *aletheia* which we translate as truth. The word literally means 'unhiddenness'. Truth is not a thing, it is rather an event. Truth happens to us when the coverings of illusion are stripped away and what is real emerges into the open. 'When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth.' The truth we are promised if we live the demands of this season of Lent consists not in new furniture for the mind, but in exposure to the reality of God's presence in ourselves and the world. The Spirit promises to bring us into truth by stripping away some more of the insulation and barriers which have separated us from living contact with reality, the reality of God, of God's world, and our true selves.

May your Lenten experience be a blessed one,
